TEXTURED FLOWER

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The textured flowers have been a fun project. It was done with water colors at a meeting I had attended and thought it would be fun to try it on porcelain.

(This is my version)

First Fire:

Block in colors on the tile. Suggested colors Blue, Yellow, Ruby, Chartreuse fluff *a little* don't over work.

Texture with bubble wrap, lace, saran wrap, corrugated card board or any type of texture you can think of.

Fire 016

Second Fire

Trace around the edge of your flower design. Put Red Resist <u>ON</u> the <u>flower (not around the flowers)</u>. Wet ground the outer side of the tile around the flowers.

WET GROUNDING:

Mix the paint powder with Grounding Oil, to a very thick consistency. So thick it is hard to mix with the palette knife. Mix this really well so there is no dry paint any where (the more you mix the better).

Then mix this with Lavender Oil so it is very soupy, almost like water.

Brush this on with a brush and pounce it with a sponge to even the paint. Do not make it real thick Two thin coats are better than one thick one.

WORK QUICKLY

When you are done let it dry so it will not run when it is fired. Fire 016

Third Fire

Trace the detail of the flower design. Paint the flower design as you normally would. Fire 016

Forth Fire etc.

Paint the flower design as many times as you need to put depth in your design. Fire 016
